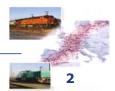




MAIN ATRIBUTES OF THE EU STRATEGIC HUBS (I)

In order to determine where in Europe the biggest initial efforts should be concentrated, we define the concept of strategic socio-economic hubs. "Strategic" hubs are the hierarchically most relevant hubs in promoting European growth and competitiveness. We define EU strategic socio-economic hubs as agglomerations with:

- A significant population (at least 1 % of the EU population),
- good transport infrastructure (motorways, railways, sea or inland ports and airports with very strong international links
- efficient complementary facilities (universities and research centers, business schools, shopping districts, etc.).





MAIN ATRIBUTES OF THE EU STRATEGIC HUBS (II)

The main attributes or characteristics of the EU strategic socio-economic hubs are related to logistics and industry. A key point is that they should be zones with highly diversified economic activity, including a wide variety of sectors, such as: aeronautical, agrifood, automotive, ceramics, construction auxiliary industry, electronics, iron and steel, logistics services, metallurgical, mining, petrochemical, pharmaceutical, railway rolling stock manufacturing, textile and clothing, etc., that allows reduced logistics costs and improves bi-directional flow balances.



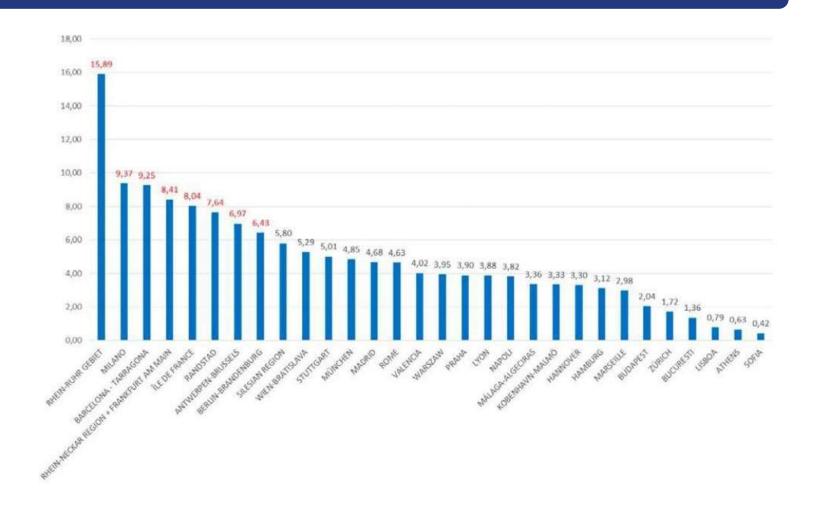


FACTORS USED AS SELECTION CRITERIA

- **Inflows**, **outflows**: total freight volume handled per day for distances over 300 km resulting from the matrix.
- Manufacturing Gross Value Added (GVA): the value added of manufactured goods produced in an area or an economic sector linked to manufacturing activities.
- **Population:** First filter to select the main EU urban agglomerations as candidates to become a Strategic Hub. For the Strategic Hubs, the population of their corresponding urban agglomeration has to exceed the 1 % of the EU population (4.5 m inhabitants). For the EU Interrelated Hubs, their population has to be between 0.5 % and 1 % of the total EU population (2.2 to 4.5 m inhabitants).
- **Combined Index:** value resulting from combining the population, GVA and inflow-outflow values.
